# INTERNATIONAL CLASSES

#### 6 international classes (each with 18 students)

- refugees and immigrants
- high diversity concerning: status, socio-cultural background, education, personal skills and interests, life experiences, trauma, learning disabilities

#### The minimum common goal: integrating in Germany

- a) learning the language and cultural skills
- b) achiving school degrees; learning a profession or getting a job

#### The minimum common experience:

leaving and losing "safe grounds": the home country, friends and family

## main goals:

- experiencing school as a safe place of orientation
- .life-world orientation and integration
- integration into the education system / labor market
- attending personal development and identity
- .attending individual learning and skills
- (strengths oriented)

### **CURRICULUM**

 international classes are assigned to classes of occupational preparation for apprenticeships or jobs. = basically the same curriculum

3 occupational fields: metal technology; health and social service; body care

### structures and organisation

- language tests when entering the class
- classroom teacher (GSL) (should teach many hours in the class)
- second GSL teacher
- permanent classroom for each class
- close cooperation with social worker and careers adviser
- •flexible length of time in the international class (1-2 years)
- periodic individual counseling (3-4 times a year)
- •weekly council circles in each class
- •obliging classroom rules transparent consequences when breaking them
- •generally organisation in classes mixed practical groups
- •school life: excursions; projects; celebrations;

#### occupational orientation

- introducing occupational fields and professions in the classroom
- application training
- career counceling
- external practical training (one day a week + 2 weeks in a row)
- •planned: skill tests and training

### individual learning

- open tasks to specific topics
- differentiation concerning learning material additional material to books
- using the library
- •participating in the tuition of regular classes (math, English, ...)
